

DOWNTIME CHECKLIST

This Downtime Checklist identifies essential features and benefits for consideration in purchasing a downtime solution. We invite you to compare options and prioritize based on your needs.

Features	Description	INTERBÄT	Comparison
Ease of Use	Familiar look and feel – intuitive operation. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Emulate Existing Workflows	Ability to tailor to existing hospital workflows: Register and document without paper, no manual re-entry. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Flexible	Must be able to accommodate existing requirements and demonstrate the ability to accommodate future needs. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Reliability	System must be available under all possible downtime scenarios, including the impact of a cyber event. It must be able to operate where the patient and clinicians are and not be dependent on external tools or information. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Sustainable	System must continue be available in the event of an extended cyber attack downtime. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Isolated	The system must be protected from cyberevents which may impact the hospital system. This means the elimination of any and all contamination vectors. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Integration	Ability to support Integration via standards: HL7, FHIR, JSON. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Communications	System should demonstrate the ability to display information without reliance or dependence on network or internet resources. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Built-in testing & QC	The system must integrate tools to validate data integrity and offer ways to simplify the requirement of regular testing to ensure on-going reliability. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Not an EMR	Unless it can provide all the functionality of a trusted EMR (unlikely), it should ensure users understand it is a familiar, but different system. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Support and Service	Is the vendor knowledgeable, accessible, and have the resources to provide support and service as you might require? NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High		
Trusted Advisor	Would you invite the vendor to have a 'seat at the table'; someone you trust to understand your business & have your interests in mind. NOTES: PRIORITY: Low Med High
